ALH186 Medical Terminology

Thursday 4:30 – 7:45

Pre: Communications proficiency

Designed to instruct the student in the most common word roots, prefixes, and suffixes in medical terminology. Emphasis is on spelling, word drills, pronunciation exercises, and definition of words. The student develops a broad medical vocabulary used by professionals in medical and allied health fields. Fulfills open electives.

CMP101 Composition 1

Thursday 5:30 p.m. – 8:45 p.m.

Pre: Communications proficiency

Emphasis is on developing skills of writing, reading, analytical thinking, and research. Students are introduced to thought provoking ideas in readings from a variety of disciplines and learn to organize material, analyze ideas, and produce clear writing. Fulfills open and liberal arts electives.

FFL100 - First Year Experience

Wednesday 4:30 p.m. – 7:45 p.m.

Pre: CPT Reading = 32 or above or equivalent

This course provides the skills, knowledge, and abilities for academic persistence and performance development, as well as the psychosocial influencers on college and career success. In addition to decision making, critical thinking, study, oral and written communication skills, topics include educational goal setting, college orientation, successful academic behaviors, and career and life planning. Emphasis is placed on cross cultural awareness, personal and social responsibility, resource availability, and college policies and procedures. This course is highly recommended for first-year students and students seeking an Associate Degree. Fulfills open and liberal arts electives.

GRA101 Introduction to Graphic Design

Monday/Wednesday 4:30 p.m. – 5:55 p.m.

Pre: Communications & Math

This course presents the formal elements of idea generation and creativity, typography, color and layout principles in the context of design responsibility and the development of professional attitudes and approaches to problem solving. Basic graphic design history, terminology and design elements are studied and applied. Projects will be manually completed from rough draft to finished plan according to best practice design and workflow procedures. Cultural, ethical, and environmental influences on design from a local and global perspective will be investigated.

MAT151 Pre-Calculus

Thursday 5:00 p.m. – 8:15 p.m.

Pre: CEAR 82 or above, or SATM 560 or above or ACT 24 or equivalent

First of a two-course sequence which prepares students for the study of Calculus. A study of advanced topics in algebra including: equations, inequalities, functions, properties of functions, zeros of polynomial functions and complex numbers, graphs of functions including polynomial and rational functions, logarithmic and exponential functions. Fulfills open, liberal arts, and mathematics electives.

SPE102 Speech

Tuesday 4:30 p.m. – 7:45 p.m.

Pre: None

Focuses on the nature and effects of verbal communication. Students will become familiar with the communication process, including some of the following: principles of organization, purpose, language structure, effective delivery, and audience analysis. Students individually will use these elements in informative and persuasive speaking in the traditional speaker-audience relationship. Fulfills open, liberal arts, and humanities electives.
