Financial Aid regulations assume that the family has primary responsibility for meeting the educational costs of students. You are considered a dependent student according to the financial aid definition and your aid eligibility is determined by using parent income and asset information in addition to your information. **Dependent students are required by law to provide parental information and signatures to be considered for financial aid.**

The U.S. government has identified five conditions that, individually or in combination with one another, do NOT qualify as "unusual circumstances" for a dependency override. Those circumstances that are **not** considered a basis for an appeal are:

- Parent(s) unwilling to provide information on the FAFSA or for verification
- Parent(s) not claiming student as a dependent on their tax return
- Student is not being supported by parents and is completely self-supporting
- Parent(s) refuse to contribute to the student's education
- Parent(s) live in a foreign country

Occasionally, students should be considered independent due to unusual circumstances (for example, parent is incarcerated or otherwise unable to communicate due to severe health reasons, etc.). **If you can document why you should be considered independent for some other unusual reason, please provide all of the following documents for review.**

What Documentation Should I Provide?

- Personal Statement by Student**- Attach a typed personal statement that summarizes the unusual circumstances with your name, school ID, date and signature. Your statement should include the following information: (1) last date and nature of parent contact, (2) location of your parents, and (3) how you are supporting yourself.
- Two Personal Statements by Third Party**- Attach two letters. One from a professional individual not related to you (counselor, social worker, teacher, clergy, police etc.). The second letter should be from a non-professional individual (relative, family friend etc.) who is familiar with your situation.
- Additional Supporting Documentation (Optional)**- Attach copies of any relevant supporting documentation (court documents, legal documents, police reports etc.)
- Proof of Income**- Attach a copy of your 2015 Federal Tax Transcript, 2015 W2 form(s), statement of benefits (welfare, social security etc.) and/or statement of how you are supporting yourself if you cannot provide the documentation listed.
- 2017-2018 FAFSA**- If you have not submitted the 2017-2018 FAFSA, complete and submit the form without parent information.
