- This certificate is intended to prepare students, upon completion, to teach young children (aged 2.9 - 6 years) in preschool settings such as child care centers, nursery school programs, Head Start Programs, and family child care centers.
- If your goal is to work with infants and/or toddlers, please refer to the Infant/Toddler Educator Certificate program.
- Students are encouraged to work with a faculty advisor.
- Courses are listed in the recommended order that you should take them.
- Students are required to take ECE 105 - Using the Expressive Arts before or concurrently with ECE 245 - Field Placement 1.
- ECE245 - Field Placement 1 requires a student teaching placement in a preschool setting, four mornings a week, typically from 8:00 am - 12 noon.
- When planning to register for ECE 245, contact the ECE Program Coordinator Gina Pelletier (gpelleti@northshore.edu) to make arrangements for your student teaching placement.
- Many courses have prerequisite requirements that must be fulfilled to be eligible to enroll in the course.
- All degree audits for graduation purposes will be based off the official program of study the student is enrolled in.
- Simultaneous awarding of Certificate and Degree policy: Certificates with coursework is embedded in an Associate's degree program will not be awarded in the same term as the degree.
