Advising Notes

- This degree is intended to prepare students, upon completion, to teach young children (ages 2.9 – 6 years) in preschool settings such as child care centers, nursery school programs, Head Start programs, and family child care centers.
- This program qualifies graduates (21 years of age or older) for Department of Early Education and Care Lead Teacher Certification.
- Students are encouraged to work with a faculty advisor. Courses are listed in the recommended order that you should take them.
- Students are required to take ECE105 Using the Expressive Arts before or concurrently with ECE245 - Field Placement 1 and are required to take ECE203 - Planning Programs before or concurrently with ECE246 Field Placement 2.
- ECE245 Field Placement 1 and ECE246 Field Placement 2 require student teaching placements in a preschool setting, four mornings a week, typically from 8:00 am – 12 noon.
- When planning to register for ECE245 or ECE246, contact the ECD program coordinator, Gina Pelletier (gpelleti@northshore.edu) to make arrangements for your student teaching placement.
- Graduates of this program may also transfer to public and private institutions into the professional development track. Check your receiving institution to determine best credit transfer options.
- Many courses have prerequisite requirements that must be fulfilled to be eligible to enroll in the course.
- If you intend to graduate with an associate degree in two years, you should enroll in at least 15 credits if taking only fall/spring courses.
- Completing 30 credits each year helps students stay on track to timely graduation.
- Taking classes in the winter intersession and summer can accelerate your time to degree completion.
- All student degree audits for graduation purposes will be based off the official program of study the student is enrolled in.
