	The Application Process Checklist
Initial when complete	Required Documentation
·	1. NSCC Application for Admission Complete the application for the year for which you are applying; regardless of whether you are a new or current student (a previously submitted application does not count). Submit your application along with your essay and TEAS score (if you tested at NSCC).
	2. TEAS Exam The preferred site for the ATI TEAS exam is North Shore Community College. Online TEAS exams are not accepted at this time. Students must take the ATI TEAS Version 7. Students whose score reports reflect that they have tested more than two times or at another location other than NSCC must also submit an official TEAS transcript from ATI: https://atitesting.com/ati_store/Additional charges may apply. TEAS inquiries may be directed to: TEAS@northshore.edu
	NSCC reserves the right to verify all TEAS score reports. Exams taken in testing locations other than at NSCC must adhere to the proctoring requirements with a secured browser. Applicants are limited to three attempts within an academic year (September 1-August 31), regardless of the testing site and program to which they are applying.
	ATI TEAS Minimum Required Scores for the Nursing Education Program: Reading = 69% Math = 73% Science = 50% English = 66.7% Candidates who have an earned Bachelor of Science degree and have completed A+P1 and 2 within the last 10 years with a C grade or better are exempt from taking the TEAS exam. Transfer students from an ACEN or CCNE accredited Nurse Education Program who earned 16 credits of Nursing courses in the past 5 years with a "B" or better are exempt from this exam.
	3. Essay The following word-processed essay written in the English language must be attached for the year in which you are applying:
	Please state why you would like to pursue a Nurse Education career and include the qualities you feel make you a good candidate for our program. Identify strategies you will use to ensure success in the Nurse Education Program. The essay should be approximately 1-2 pages in length and must answer both questions. Please be sure to answer all components to this question.
	4. Official transcripts from ALL Colleges/Universities previously attended All official college transcripts from previously attended Colleges/Universities MUST be submitted directly to NSCC and uploaded by Admissions staff. If you have previously submitted transcripts and have since completed courses or are currently registered for courses, then you need to submit an updated transcript. 	Anatomy and Physiology I & II and Introduction to Microbiology credit must be less than 10 years to transfer into the Program. Grade of C or better is required.

Chemistry Requirement	Course can be High School or College level and must have a final grade of C or higher (no time limit)
Math Requirement	ONE of the following (no time limit on any of the following): Completion of high school algebra with a final grade of C or higher. MAT110 or equivalent with a final grade of C or higher. MAT094 or equivalent with a final grade of C or higher. MAT002 or MAT061 with a C or higher completed Fall 2016 or later. Module 8 or higher. Math proficiency and CEAR score of 54 or NGQA score of 262 or higher Math ACT score of 22 or higher SAT score of 510 or higher (if taken prior to 2016) SAT score of 540 or higher (if taken in 2016 or later) TEAS math score of 73 or higher College level math course with final grade of C or higher
Completed Course Requirements (Prior to Fall 2025 Semester)	All students accepted into Nurse Education will be required to have completed Anatomy and Physiology 1 (NSCC BIO211) and Composition 1 (NSCC CMP101) prior to the start of the Fall 2025 semester.

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	Nurse Education Transfer Students Requirements ONLY Transfer students from another ACEN or CCNE accredited Nurse Education program looking to receive transfer credit must also provide:

	An official transcript proving enrollment in nursing courses within the last 2 years.
	A grade of "B" or better in a comparable nursing course is required for transfer credit. However, transfer credits are NOT guaranteed and will be evaluated upon acceptance into the program.
	Letter of recommendation from the Nurse Education Program, preferably from a clinical instructor or Nursing Faculty Adviser. (Letter must be included with your application and be in a sealed envelope with the recommender's signature across the seal)
	Documentation showing completion of at least 8 credits of comparable course work in an ACEN or CCNE accredited Nurse Education program.
	Course syllabi from all previous Nurse Education courses. Additional documents can be emailed to: SelectiveAdmissions@northshore.edu
