The Application Process Checklist

Initial when complete	Required Documentation
	<p>1. Mandatory Information Session Attendance</p> <p>Applicants must attend a Mandatory Information Session during the academic year prior to admission (after August, 2024). Upcoming dates are available by visiting: northshore.edu/academics/programs/rad/mandatory-info-sessions.html. Attendance will be recorded.</p>
	<p>2. NSCC Application for Admission</p> <p>Complete the application for the year for which you are applying; regardless of whether you are a new or current student (a previously submitted application does not count). You must indicate if you are applying for the traditional option of study or the accelerated option of study.</p>
	<p>3. TEAS Exam</p> <p>The preferred site for the ATI TEAS exam is North Shore Community College. Online TEAS exams are not accepted at this time. Students must take the ATI TEAS Version 7. Students whose score reports reflect that they have tested more than two times or at another location other than NSCC must also submit an official TEAS transcript from ATI: https://atitesting.com/ati_store/. Additional charges may apply. TEAS inquiries may be directed to: TEAS@northshore.edu</p> <p>NSCC reserves the right to verify all TEAS score reports for exams taken in testing locations other than NSCC. Exams taken at locations other than NSCC must adhere to proctoring requirements with a secured browser.</p> <p>TEAS@northshore.edu</p> <p>Applicants are limited to three attempts within a year (September 1 - August 31), regardless of the testing site and program to which they are applying.</p> <p>ATI TEAS Minimum Required Scores for the Practical Nursing Program: Reading = 69% Math = 70% Science = 50% English = No minimum score</p> <p>EXEMPTION: Applicants who have earned a bachelor's degree from an academic institution accredited by a regional or national accrediting agency recognized by the U.S. Department of Education, AND have completed both Anatomy & Physiology 1 and 2 with a "C" grade or better will have the TEAS requirement waived.</p>
	<p>4. Essay</p> <p>A word-processed essay written in the English language must be submitted for the year in which you are applying. (Essay must be typed and only 1 page in length). Grammar and spelling are considered in addition to content and quality of your essay.</p> <p><i>Please state why you would like to pursue a career in Radiologic Technology and what qualities do you feel would make you a good candidate for our program.</i></p>
	<p>5. High School Transcript or GED score report</p> <p>Attach a copy of your high school transcript or GED score report. If you previously submitted the transcript or score report and attended classes within the past 5 years, then Enrollment likely has it on file. Communications Proficiency	There are many ways to demonstrate this. (See link below.) The most common ways to meet this requirement are: (1) A 2.7 cumulative high school GPA for students who have graduated from a U.S. high school within the past ten years; (2) A Reading/Writing SAT Scores of 550+ (2016 or later); (3) College level math courses with grade of C- or better. northshore.edu/academics/proficiency/communications-proficiency.html
Math Proficiency	Math proficiency can be achieved in many ways (see link for complete listing); the most common ways to meet this requirement are: (1) A 2.7 cumulative high school GPA for students who have graduated from a U.S. high school within the past ten years; (2) A Math SAT Scores of 540+ (2016 or later); (3) College level math courses with grade of C or better. northshore.edu/academics/proficiency/math-proficiency.html
Math Requirement	ONE of the following courses or testing options: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • CEAR 54 or above or NGQA 262 or above • Math SAT score of 510 or higher (if taken prior to 2016) • Math SAT score of 540 or higher (if taken in 2016 or later) • Math ACT score of 22 or higher • MAT002 or MAT061 with a C or higher completed Fall 2016 or later. • Module 8 or higher. • MAT110 or equivalent with a final grade of C or higher. • College level math course with final grade of C or higher
Biology Requirement	ONE of the following courses or testing options: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • BIO211 with a grade of C or higher • BIO101 or BIO105 with a grade of C or higher (no time limit) • TEAS - Science section score of 50% or higher (no time limit) • LPN Certificate (no time limit) • Bachelor of Science in Biological science (no time limit) • One of the following within the past 5 calendar years: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> – H.S. Biology with a C or higher – CLEP test with a score of 50 or higher – AP Biology Test with a 3 or higher
Official transcripts from ALL Colleges/Universities previously attended	All official college transcripts from previously attended Colleges/Universities MUST be submitted directly to NSCC and uploaded by Admissions staff. If you have previously submitted transcripts and have since completed courses or are currently registered for courses, then you need to submit an updated transcript .
