The biology course must have a laboratory component. The biology course must be for science or health science majors. A high school class will meet this requirement, as long as the applicant earned a final grade of "C" or better and the student: • took the class while in high school • completed the class within 5 years of application • graduated high school within 5 years of application Students may be enrolled in the prerequisite course at the time of application, but admission remains conditional until a final grade of C or better is submitted no later than June 30th, prior to the Fall start. 	A word-processed questionnaire must be uploaded for the year in which you are applying:
Essays	 Describe how your life/work experiences and extracurricular, and/or volunteer activities contributed to you choosing to become a Veterinary Technician. How do you plan to manage your academic commitments and your other life commitments while enrolled in this rigorous program? As a member of the healthcare team, what is the role of a Veterinary Technician? Describe a challenging personal or work situation. How did you manage the situation? What did you learn from the situation? Discuss your prior experiences with math and science courses. Which were your favorites and why?
Letter of Recommend ation	Applicants must submit ONE letter of recommendation. This may be an academic or professional letter of recommendation. You will need to enter the name and email of your reference into your application and a direct link to upload a letter of recommendation will be sent directly to them. (Your application will not be complete and able to be submitted until this has been entered.)
Resume	Submit a resume highlighting your academic, extracurricular and work history.

Rabies Pre- Exposure Vaccination Requirement	The Rabies pre-exposure vaccination series <i>DOES NOT</i> have to be completed prior to submitting an APPLICATION to the program. Once accepted: Students using personal health insurance need to demonstrate they have started the series by submitting documentation with their health packet by the due date. Documentation that the series is completed needs to be submitted no later than August 2021 (date TBD) prior to starting class in the fall. Students with health insurance through NSCC will have until October 2021 (date TBD) to complete the vaccination series. Students that have completed their pre-exposure Rabies vaccine series greater than 2 years from when starting the program must submit a titer level for the vaccine with their health packet. If you have had a titer done within 1 year of starting the program, please submit the results with your health packet. A veterinary technology student who is in contact with patients may be exempt from the Rabies pre-exposure immunization requirement due to a medical or religious exemption. Submission of documentation will be required and, if sufficient to qualify for a medical or religious exemption, it will be granted. Failure to complete pre-exposure Rabies vaccination may impact or prevent a student from participating in a Service Learning component of a class. Information on where to obtain the rabies pre-exposure vaccination series is available at the Mandatory Information Sessions or by contacting the Program Director at: lking@northshore.edu . Information on financial assistance available through the college to aid in offsetting the cost of the rabies pre-exposure vaccination series is available to qualified students once accepted into the program. **COVID-19 UPDATE: Dates for completion of the Rabies preexposure vaccination series will be determined in spring 2021, based on current circumstances due to COVID-19.
